BROCHURE PRINTING IN MULTIPLE LANGUAGES

In continuous efforts to ensure Seattle's diverse communities receive information regarding public safety services, SPD developed and the Foundation printed brochures in multiple languages.

YOUTH AND POLICE LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE

Over 150 youth from North Seattle attended the Youth and Police Leadership Conference at Ballard High School, funded by the Seattle Police Foundation. The conference is being used as a model for additional conferences to be held in subsequent years in different parts of Seattle.

TRANSLATING EQUIPMENT

SPD convenes many meetings with community groups where English is spoken as a second language or not at all by many attendees. The translating equipment allows the meeting to be held in multiple languages simultaneously.

LIFE CHOICES AND THE LAW CONFERENCE

Over one hundred students ranging from 6th to 9th grades and forty parents attended the first Life Choices and the Law Conference. Students attended 'The Law and You', 'Decision Making', 'Street SMART', and 'Role Reversal Scenarios' workshops. Parents attended a workshop with the presiding juvenile judge and various community based providers to discuss gang, truancy and at-risk youth issues. AUTO THEFT INVESTIGATORS TRAINING SEMINAR

Given Seattle's high rates of auto theft, the Foundation funded officers' attendance at a specialized training program for auto theft investigators. Given the nature and complexity of auto theft crimes (i.e. VIN-switching, chop shops and trafficking in stolen automobiles), specialized training will enhance the detectives' ability to properly investigate and prosecute offenders.

SEATTLE POLICE GYMS

In an effort to support and encourage physical health of officers and all SPD personnel, the Foundation helped purchase gym equipment for a new SPD facility.

HORSEMANSHIP CLINIC FOR THE MOUNTED UNIT

Seattle Police Department's Mounted Unit helps the City maintain safe crowd control during our many community-based events. The horsemanship clinic provides an opportunity for the officers in the unit to obtain advanced training with their horses.

Enhance Law Enforcement Services-

The Foundation helps augment law enforcement services by supporting the following advanced technology and specialized equipment projects as well as projects that enhance the effectiveness of specialty units:

CRIME SCENE PHOTOGRAMMETRY & VIRTUAL TOUR EQUIPMENT

This highly specialized and advanced technology provides provide enhanced photo-documentation/evidence preservation at crime scenes, and virtual crime scene tour ability post-incident and during prosecution of serious crimes.

COMMUNITY POLICE TEAM (CPT) VIDEO CAMERA & PLAYBACK EQUIPMENT

In order to solve complex, long-term problems CPT must document and analyze the situation in-depth then coordinate responses from multiple agencies and departments. Having video documentation allows a quicker resolution and more thorough understanding of the problem and its root causes.

K-9 DOG

In its ongoing support of the K-9 Unit, the Foundation purchased one specially bred and trained K-9 dog.

BALLISTIC ARMOR ENHANCEMENT

Recent ballistic testing revealed that several commercially available ammunition types can penetrate the armor on a Peacekeeper vehicle, thereby endangering those officers inside the vehicles, as well as any persons being rescued from a critical incident. SPF funded the upgrade in the ballistic armor on one Peacekeeper armored rescue vehicles to a level that will stop commercially available rifle ammunition.
